Voices & Images: Monterey Remembered A Huge Success

The "Voices & Images: Monterey Remembered" grant project has been a huge success. The project to collect interviews and photos from Japanese-American families from Monterey has exceeded our expectations.

Sixteen individuals participated in on-camera interviews, the interviews have been transcribed, and the photos have been digitized for the archival collection. A selection of 30 photos were enlarged, framed, and exhibited at the charming Mexican-era adobe, Casa Gutierrez. Another 50 photos were mounted and displayed in museum cases.

The exhibition opened with a reception on October 2, drawing about 130 guests. Subsequently, another 250 or more guests have enjoyed the exhibit and provided very positive feedback. Monterey's Japanese-American community has been especially supportive and appreciative of the exhibit. On the second Sunday after opening, about 25 Japanese-American families gathered in the gallery at once, pointing out photos of friends and family, laughing and telling stories.

Work continues on the project as it is the hope of the library to find another venue for the framed photos to be exhibited. The transcriptions will also need to be proof-read, bound and cataloged. The interviews will also be cataloged and added to the California History Room's archival collections, where they will eventually become available to researchers.

This project of the Friends of the Monterey Public Library is funded through a grant from the Thomas Doud, the Sr. and Anita M. Doud Fund 1 and the Maria DeVoe Fund of the Community Foundation for Monterey County. The project committee—Patty Cal, Claire Rygg, Anne Washburn and Suzie Wood—worked closely with library staff to bring the project to fruition. Special thanks also go to Treasurer Wayne Cruzan for keeping tabs on the budget, and to all those who worked in the Casa Gutierrez to keep the gallery open throughout October.



From the Interim Director



Fall is an exciting time at Monterey Public Library. If you visit the library on a weekday afternoon, you are likely to encounter clusters of teenagers attending teen programs, and swirling about the building like

autumn leaves, waiting for their parents to rake them up, and bundle them home. Thanks to support from the FRIENDS, last year's Monterey County Weekly Gives campaign funded "21st Century Learners" providing funds for our Teen Librarian to teach 21st Century Learning Skills to teens. This fall we are harvesting the benefits of that initiative. Our Teen Librarian has been hard at work providing instruction sessions to help students learn to become effective team members, engaged citizens of the community, self directed, life-long learners and successful researchers. The funds will also make it possible for staff to work in small groups and one-on-one with teenagers who are struggling with technology, research, and communication skills. With FRIENDS' support we've launched a well-attended monthly Craft Club for adults and a Lego Club for kids, where children participate in creative free-building to support the use of critical thinking, problem-solving, and social skills. The FRIENDS have also helped us add hundreds of new reading materials for customers of all ages – don't miss our new book shelves the next time you visit. Looking ahead, the FRIENDS are initiating another Monterey County Weekly Gives campaign this winter. Funds raised will support the 2016 Summer Reading Program "Read for the Win!" Children's and Teen programs offered at the Library this coming summer will not only exercise mind and body, they will help kids avoid 'the summer slide' where research shows that children who don't read in the summer can see their reading skills decline as much as one grade level. The Library is participating in the 2016 statewide summer reading program with a goal of 1 million readers! "Read for the Win!," the 2016 state-wide theme focuses on sports and games to coincide with the XXXI Olympiad in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Locally, we will partner with the City of Monterey Recreation Department and others to create programs that provide both reading and physical activity for the children and teens of your community. FRIENDS and libraries—a winning combination in any season.


From the President
